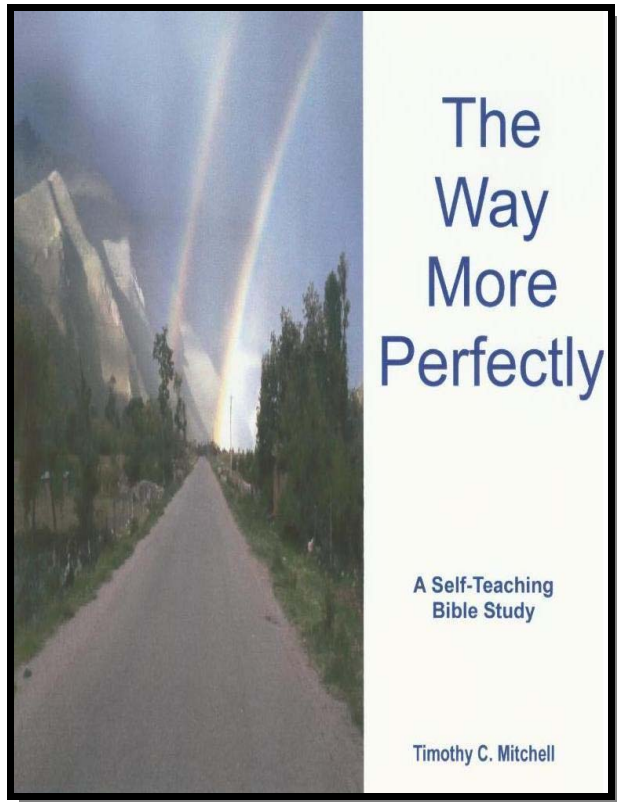


Sample Material

We started New Testament Christian Center in our home. After several years of difficult, slow growth, I prayed for God to give me a soul-winning tool to reach my city. The self-teaching 2-day **The Way More Perfectly** Bible study was the result. This became our primary follow-up visitor tool. Most of the people in our assembly have been won through it.



It is our experience that most people to whom we teach **The Way More Perfectly** Bible study will get the Holy Ghost and be baptized immediately after its conclusion. Many receive the Holy Ghost coming out of the water. Another unique observation is that there are few “chronic” seekers. After prayer, we realized that the reason for this is because “faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of the Lord” (Romans 10:17). For example, when you teach about how to receive the Holy Ghost using the illustration of the wind as Jesus did with Nicodemus in John 3:8, then the student knows what to expect when he feels the Holy Ghost and how to respond (like leaves on a tree when the wind blows). We ask our people to teach this Bible study first before bringing a person to church so they will understand true spiritual worship and be ready to participate and receive when they do come.

- **Doctors Doyin and Sesi Ogunbi.** We were attending a charismatic church where our children were going to their private school. One Sunday, on our way to church, we felt led by the Spirit to get on I-85 and go north. We saw New Testament Christian Center (NTCC) and came for a visit. step was to make sure the heart was beating. Sesi informed him that she looked for different evidence—the loud cry of life. Successful birth depended on all the air passages being clear and the wind getting into the lungs. The pastor compared that to a person being born again as the wind of the Holy Ghost enters in and he/she begins speaking in tongues. We perfectly understood this illustration and in the next few weeks we both were baptized in Jesus Name and received the Holy Ghost. Pastor Mitchell now uses that illustration in **The Way More Perfectly**. (See the excerpts below.)

- **Lee and Johnnie Tucker.** When Pastor Mitchell first saw me, I was in the hospital with a stroke. The right side of my face and body drooped. I was devastated because my husband and I were gospel singers. Our daughter was going to NTCC and she had asked the pastor to visit me. When I got out of the hospital he came to our home and taught us **The Way More Perfectly**. In a few weeks, I started attending and was baptized and received the Holy Ghost. Our marriage was going through a difficult time because our teenage children were giving us a lot of trouble. The worker shared some truth with me and as a result, Pastor Mitchell came and taught me **The Way More Perfectly**. INTRODUCTION

•Isaiah 28:9-12 *“Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little: For with stammering lips and another tongue will he speak to this people. To whom he said, This is the rest wherewith ye may cause the weary to rest; and this is the refreshing...”*

The proper method to understand and gain knowledge of God’s Word is by comparing scriptures on that particular subject. The Bible says, *“in the mouth of two or three witnesses let every word be established.”* (See Deuteronomy 17:6, Matthew 18:16 and II Corinthians 13:1.) Taking two or preferably three scriptures concerning the same subject and establishing truth is the correct way to form a Biblical doctrine. For example, if a person wanted to know how to be baptized, he would find all the scriptures in the Bible pertaining to baptism. Then he would compare and combine the information to completely understand that subject and form his or her belief.

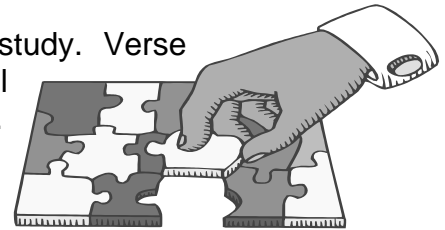
We should not establish doctrine by using only one verse of scripture. A one witness “private” interpretation has much potential for error and misinterpretation (II Peter 1:20). A good example of doctrinal error is the belief of “baptizing for the dead” which is based on only one scripture reference found in I Corinthians 15:29. By interpreting this verse literally, some have erroneously concluded that if one knows the name of their kinsmen, he can be baptized in proxy for them and thereby give them an opportunity to be saved.

If you want to really understand doctrine or a particular subject, you must study line upon line, precept upon precept, verse by verse, finding here a little and there a little. You begin searching through the Old Testament and follow the subject on into the New Testament. After thoroughly studying every related scripture on the subject, you will then know *“all the counsel of God”* (Acts 20:27). For example, on the first creative day God spoke and said, *“Let there be light”* and *“called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night”* (Genesis 1:3-5). Yet it was not until the fourth day that the sun, moon, and stars were created. What lighted the world in the meantime? To answer that we must let scripture explain scripture—line upon line, here a little and there a little. John

begins his gospel like Genesis with the creation and reveals that God was the source of all life and “the life was the light of all men” (John 1:1-10). I John 1:5 says, “God is light, and in him is not darkness at all.” Then skipping to the end of the Bible we see the final picture, “And the city had no need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof” (Revelation 21:23). These three scriptures (witnesses) teach us that God was the source of that light.

Studying the Bible is like building a brick wall. You cannot take one brick and conclude that the whole wall is that color, shape or size. You must view all the bricks together---line upon line, row after row, each separate and different yet bonded as one---to get the total picture.

The Way More Perfectly© utilizes this correct Biblical method of study. Verse by verse we will discover what the Word says concerning vital subjects. We will use each scripture as a piece of the puzzle. When we combine them all, we will have a clear picture of God’s complete and perfect will.



Lesson 2 – The Original Plan of Salvation

Introduction:

1. What does it mean when someone is asked to believe on the Lord?
2. When we believe on Jesus what happens according to the Scripture?
3. Is salvation joining a Church or accepting Christ?

I. Believing Results in the New Birth

A. The Scripture Teaches That Believing Is Not Complete Salvation But Rather the First Step of the Process.

•*Romans 10:8-13 “But what saith it? The word is nigh thee, even in thy mouth, and in thy heart: that is, the word of faith, which we preach; That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.”*

There is a very important truth contained in these verses. Everywhere in the Bible where it says to believe on the Lord Jesus, it always says that you shall be saved.¹ Notice that it does not say you are saved. A verb indicating future action is always used with the word “believe” in the Scriptures. Why? Belief alone does not save; it must be followed by action. James says, “*Faith without works is dead.*” He goes on to explain, “*Ye see then how that by*

¹ See Mark 16:16. After telling people to call on the name of the Lord and be saved in Acts 2:21, Peter did not end his message there because belief alone does not save. He continued to preach until conviction came upon his hearers and they asked, “Sirs, what must we do to be saved?” These people knew that there was something more to do. Peter then gave them the rest of the plan of salvation in verse 38.

works a man is justified, and not by faith only (James 2:14-26.) For example, what would you do if I said, "This house is on fire!" If you replied, "I believe" and did nothing, you would burn to death! Action always follows and confirms our belief. Therefore, simply repeating a statement or confession of faith does not constitute salvation. Believing on the Lord Jesus Christ does not make you a Christian any more than believing you are a doctor instantly turns you into a heart specialist. Believing is faith that you are going to become. Belief must be followed through and confirmed by action. If believing alone saves, then all the devils are saved because they "also believe (in one God) and tremble" (James 2:19)!

B. Jesus Taught That If One Is a Believer Then He Should Seek God Until He Receives the Holy Ghost.

•John 7:37-39 "Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me, and drink. He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. (But this spake he of the Spirit, which they that believe on him should receive: for the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified.)"

- a) Jesus said that if we believe on Him as the Bible tells us to, we should receive the Holy Ghost. If we are born-again believers, then we should have received the Holy Ghost! What is the Holy Ghost? First, a ghost is the spirit of one who has died. The Holy Ghost is the Spirit of God which indwelt Jesus that would be made available to dwell inside of us after His death. Just as a person can be demon-possessed, God's people are Spirit-possessed.
- b) When a person receives the Holy Ghost, it is like an artesian well springing up. Some have said it felt like a flock of butterflies wanting to come out of their stomach.

C. Jesus Discusses the New Birth With Nicodemus.

•John 3:1-2 "There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him."



Nicodemus, a well-known and respected religious leader, meets with Jesus at night to avoid unfavorable public opinion. He was a Pharisee, which means he was very educated in his religion and practiced it with extreme devotion. He could be compared to a prominent degreed minister pastoring a large church in your city who went to a traveling, unschooled, and poor evangelist to seek counsel because he realized there was more anointing and power to be had.

•Verse 3 "Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

What a shock it must have been when Jesus boldly announced that he needed to be born again! Nicodemus had a teachable spirit and was not offended.

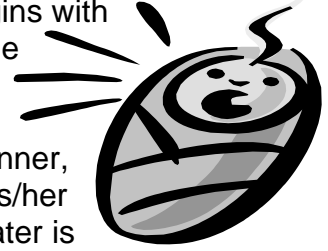
•Verse 4 "Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?"

Nicodemus thought Jesus was referring to natural birth.

•Verses 5-7 "Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again."

a) Jesus emphasized the necessity of being born again and explained it with more clarity. There are two components of new birth: water and spirit. We must do both in order to enter into the kingdom of God. Jesus used this discussion to begin introducing the plan of salvation by mentioning two keys, water baptism and the infilling of the Spirit. He did not mention repentance because Nicodemus was living a repentant life.

b) Spiritual birth and natural birth are very similar. Natural birth begins with blood, pain and struggle. Next, the water is broken and the baby passes through that area enroute to birth. When the baby emerges, the first thing everyone wants to hear is that unintelligible, loud cry which signals a live birth. In like manner, spiritual birth begins when one struggles with the pain of his/her sins until Jesus comes and covers them with His blood. The water is broken as one goes through the passage of water baptism. Finally, the wind of His Spirit enters into your body and you receive the Holy Ghost with the cry of life coming forth as you begin speaking in an unknown tongue.



It is unique that in the Bible the Greek word “pneuma” is used to describe both air and spirit. Man’s natural life began when God “*breathed into his nostrils the breath of life and man became a living soul*” (Genesis 2:7). When man sinned, he “lost his breath” and died. Jesus symbolically gave mankind a second breath when he appeared to his disciples on the day of His resurrection and prophesied of their spiritual new birth as “*he breathed on them, and saith unto them, Receive ye the Holy Ghost*” (John 20:22). This was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost when the sound of a rushing mighty wind filled the house as God breathed the life-giving Holy Ghost into all that were present (Acts 2:2-4).

•**Verse 8** “*The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.*”

Jesus compared being Spirit-filled to the wind and how it affects something when it blows upon it. For example, you cannot see the wind blowing through the trees but you can see the branches moving and hear the sound made by the wind passing through the leaves. Sometimes the wind is strong. At other times it is gentle. Sometimes you cannot even feel it, yet we know that the wind (air) is always present. So it is with people who are Spirit-filled. You cannot see the Spirit but one can see and feel the effect the Spirit has upon their body when their upraised arms shake and sway like branches on a tree and their lips tremble like a leaf. As the Spirit passes through them you can see their stammering lips and hear the sound as they speak in an unknown tongue. We must be careful not to resist the wind of the Spirit when it comes but yield automatically and spontaneously. Apostle Paul said, “*Quench not the Spirit*” and “*despise not prophesyings*”². Self-pride will cause us to be unresponsive and stiff like a concrete pillar. To receive the Holy Spirit, we should yield like a piece of paper when fanned and not be afraid for God to take control of our body, His temple. We receive the Holy Ghost only when we completely surrender.



² I Thessalonians 5:19-21. When does a person commit the unpardonable sin of blaspheming against the Holy Ghost? This is when someone continually resists the Spirit who leads and guides us into all truth (John 16:7-13) until they frustrate the grace of God. Religious people are the most susceptible to this horrible sin because of their pride, self-righteousness and inability to accept truth, which would force them to part with their man-made traditions. (See Matthew 15:1-14.) Jesus reserved his harshest words for those who fought against truth the hardest and eventually crucified him. In Matthew 12, He warned them of committing blasphemy as they continuously criticized his every move and debated His doctrine.

•Verses 16-17 *“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.”*

- a) God the Father did not tell another person in the Godhead to go down and save the world. That would have been avoiding responsibility. God made Himself a body and came to visit us in human form. We call His fleshly manifestation, Jesus. We could not go to Him so He came to us. He became what we are (a son of man) so we can become like Him (a son of God). To further understand the Godhead, substitute the word *flesh* in the place of Jesus and *Spirit* in the place of Father God as you read your Bible.
- b) God did not send Jesus to condemn us of our sins even though He who was perfect had every right to do so. Neither it is our job to find fault nor criticize. As truth is revealed, it will convict us of our errors and show us God’s will. There is a difference between man’s condemnation and being convicted by the Holy Ghost.

III. The Origins of Acts 2:38

A. How Did Peter Arrive At The Plan Of Salvation Found In Acts 2:38?

The answer is simple. He quoted Jesus’ words.

- 1) Jesus told Nicodemus in *John 3:5*, *“Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God.”* One is born of the water when he is baptized. One is born of the Spirit when he receives the gift of the Holy Ghost.
- 2) He remembered Jesus’ famous last words to his disciples in *Luke 24:47 & 49*. *“And that (1) repentance and (2) remission of sins should be preached in his name.”* (3) *“I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high.”*

B. There Are Other Old Testament Typologies That Peter Could Have Used.

In the Old Testament there are many examples, types and shadows of good things that were to come later in the New Testament. (See Colossians 2:16, Hebrews 8:5 and Hebrews 10:1.) Paul said in I Corinthians 10:11, *“Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.”* It is so exciting to know that those who were saved in the Old Testament followed a 3-step prototype plan of salvation that models Acts 2:38. Following the admonition to establish truth with two or three witnesses (Deuteronomy 19:15, Matthew 18:16), we will now journey back into the Old Testament to authenticate Acts 2:38. Notice the three keys in each incident and how they match our three-part plan of salvation.

- 1) **Noah’s Ark** in Genesis 6 had one door and three floors. This represents Jesus as the one door of the church (John 10:7) that has one Lord, one faith, and one baptism (Ephesians 4:5).

Key #1 - Repentance. God instructed Noah to “take in” [Hebrew: accept, drawn, win, bring] animals of every species into the ark (Genesis 6:19-20, 7:2). Although God instinctively drew those animals to board the ark, there was a selective process. Today we are still preaching the gospel to every creature (Mark 16: 15). Yet no one can come to Christ except the Father draws him/her (John 6:44) and are chosen by Him (John 15:16).

Key #2 - Baptism. The water saved those in the ark and caused the death of those who were disobedient and remained outside. Peter compared this incident to water baptism today, which has the same power to save us or cause our spiritual death. *“Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water. The like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us”* (I Peter 3:20-21).

Key #3 - Holy Ghost. There are several typologies to be considered in Genesis 8:6-12.

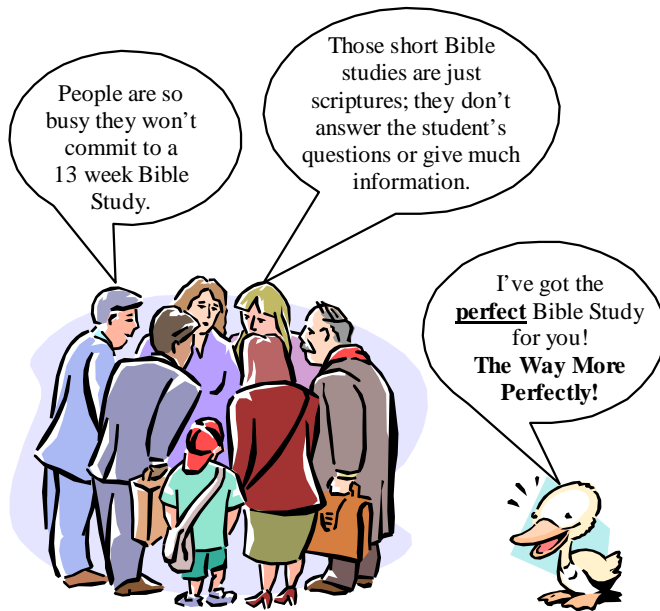
Two birds were sent out to see if the rain had dried up so the earth could be ready for human habitation. At first Noah sent out the dove and raven together. The raven did not return (Genesis 8:7). This represented the Old Testament law and ministry of death (II Corinthians 3:6-8). The dove, which was sent out three times (Genesis 8:8-12), is a type of the Holy Ghost. The first time represents when the Spirit in the Old Testament went forth and moved on people (Judges 13:25, I Samuel 10:10) but did not permanently reside in them (John 7:39). The second time is a type of when the Holy Ghost descended upon Jesus (Who is our peace-Ephesians 2:14) at His baptism (Matthew 3:16). The third time was when the Holy Ghost (Dove) went out to permanently indwell the Church (Acts 2:1-4).

- Another type of the Holy Ghost can be found in the rainbow, which represented a promise that God would not destroy the earth by water again and a *“token of the covenant”* (Genesis 9:11-14). The Holy Ghost is a promise from God (Luke 24:49, Acts 2:33-39) with tongues being the sign [token] of receiving it (1 Corinthians 14:22).

- Pitch, which was used within and without to seal the ark (Genesis 6:14), is representative of two baptisms and two sealings. *“John baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Ghost”* (Acts 1:5). Ephesians 1:13 says *“Ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise (inside)”* and *“God hath set forth (Jesus) to be the propitiation (outside covering) through faith in his blood”* (Romans 3:25).

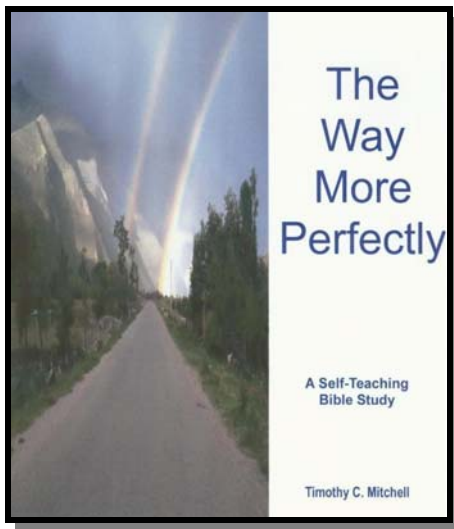
